

WV Civilian Labor Force (Seasonally Adjusted)





WV Unemployment Rate (Seasonally Adjusted)







WV Labor Force Participation Rate




Employment: Residence vs Establishment


Labor Force Participation by Age Group 2022


2022 Labor Force Participation Rate By County







LFPR: WV County vs US Gap 2022




















WV Claimant Profiles (April 2024)



Claims by Educational Attainment





WV Net Job Flows (2000-2021)





WV Population Change 1970 - 2020








Place of Residence vs. Place of Work





Working Outside State of Residence (2021)






Working Outside State of Residence (2010-2021)





Where WV Residents Work








Average Annual Wage Comparison



Recap

- WV Civilian Labor Force has been mostly static since 2000
- Labor Force Participation Rate has been improving since 2015 but has stagnated in 2023
- Largest LFPR gaps among those age 55-64
- WV is experiencing its tightest labor market since recorded data (JOLTS), but has been loosening in 2023
- Nearly half of the population is retired and older
- WV has had a negative net job flow deficit since Q4 2018
- State population is at its lowest since 1971
- WV has the highest death rate in the US
- Nearly 14% of WV residents work in another state
- WV's average annual wage lags behind the national average, widening over time
- WV has the 2nd highest disability rate in the US (19.3%) just behind Puerto Rico (21.7%)
